The Texas General Land Office (GLO) Community Development and Revitalization Program has completed its review of all materials submitted in support of the Newton County's proposed Method of Distribution (MOD) Amendment 1 for the 2016 Floods and Storms Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds. We are happy to inform you that the MOD Amendment 1 has been approved.

The terms of the approval are as noted below:

- 1. Acceptance of the MOD does not indicate the eligibility or approval of funding for any proposed projects.
- 2. The County's allocation must meet the requirement that 70 percent of funds benefit lowto moderate income persons. Projects that do not meet HUD's national objective for benefitting low- to moderate- income persons may not be approved until this allocation requirement is met.

Long-Term Planning and Recovery (Amendment 1)

Below is an explanation of how the region's method of distribution fosters long-term community recovery that is forward-looking and focused on permanent restoration of infrastructure, housing and the local economy.

In establishing the Method of Distribution for the March 2016 Flood Allocation, Newton County took a very aggressive approach to assist homeowners. We allocated 70% of the funds received by the County to Housing and DISD activities. The average MOD housing allocation for the remaining four counties is 35% with 65% going to non-housing activities. At this time we have exhausted all avenues of reaching eligible homeowners with an interest in the program and need to reallocate funds to desperately needed infrastructure restoration to aid in overall recovery from the disaster.

Unmet Housing Needs (Amendment 1)

Below is an explanation of how unmet housing needs will be addressed or how economic revitalization or infrastructure activies will contribute to long-term recovery and restoration of housing in the most impacted and distressed areas.

In administering the Housing Funds, Newton County has conducted extensive marketing efforts to ensure that all residents affected by the 2016 floods was made aware of the available programs and allowed sufficient opportunities to apply. These outreach efforts included conducting Informational Meetings at the Deweyville Senior Center in Deweyville, the Cade Building in Burkeville, and Newton County Courthouse in Newton on 9/18/2018 & 9/19/2018 to explain the programs and their eligibility requirements. Newspaper ads published on 9/12/2018 and 9/19/2018, radio advertising, flyers, and personal phone calls to approximately 1100 FEMA recipients were used to invite residents to these informational meetings. Approximately 269 people attended this first round of meetings. The initial application intake period was for 90 days from 9/18/2018 to 12/17/2018. In early December 2018, workshops were conducted to assist any residents that needed extra help filling out their applications.

Newton County elected to re-open their application intake period for another 60 days from 3/1/2019 to 4/30/2019. In conjunction with this intake period, newspaper ads were published on 2/20/2019 and 2/27/2019. Another round of Informational Meetings was conducted at the same locations as previously held. In Deweyville, only two homeowners attended, and one had already applied. No homeowners attended the Burkeville meeting and only a few homeowners attended the meeting in Newton.

Once the County began constructing homes, the Newton County News published 11 front page articles and Orange Leader published one article celebrating these accomplishments. As more residents became aware of the programs through these articles, word of mouth, What's Up Deweyville's Facebook page and other personal social media accounts, the County opened its application intake period once again. In an effort to serve additional residents, the last intake period was for 30 days and it ended on July 18, 2019.

Due to Hurricane Harvey, other storms, and normal deterioration, there continues to be unmet housing needs in Newton County. In order to be eligible for this program residents had to own, occupy, and receive damage to their homes during the 2016 floods. It is believed that all eligible residents affected by the 2016 floods having an interest in assistance have submitted an application at this time.

The amended budget for housing contains funding to assist all remaining applicants for the 2016 floods. Unmet housing needs related to other disasters will continue to be addressed through Harvey HAP assistance, Harvey buyout assistance and TDHCA Housing funding as applicable.

The remaining funds in the 2016 Newton County allocation are desperately needed to assist in restoring infrastructure for the overall recovery and economic revitalization of the county.

Method of Distribution Detail

The County is required to prepare a method of distribution between the eligible entities or projects. The GLO has directed the County to use a direct allocation technique based on objective, verifiable data. The Method of Distribution will identify how it meets benefiting 70% low-to-moderate persons requirement., supports minimum allocation amounts that help ensure project feasibility, and provides an explanation of the distribution factors selected.

Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing Statement

All subrecipients will certify that they will affirmatively further fair housing ("AFFH") in their grant agreements, and will receive GLO training and technical assistance in meeting their AFFH obligations. Additionally, all project applications will undergo AFFH review by GLO before approval. Such review will include assessment of a proposed project's area demography, socioeconomic characteristics, housing configuration and needs, educational, transportation, and health care opportunities, environmental hazards or concerns, and all other factors material to the AFFH determination. Applications should show that projects are likely to lessen area racial, ethnic, and low-income concentrations, and/or promote affordable housing in low-poverty, nonminority areas in response to natural hazard related impacts.

- Activity must be a CDBG-eligible project;
- Activity must be in response to a 2016 disaster(s)related impact in one of the following ways:
 - Direct verifiable damage from the disaster(s) that requires improvement of conditions, or
 - The facilities must have failed to function in the normal capacity as a result of the disaster(s).
- The County has added a stipulation that projects must meet a regionally-established recovery priority.







In establishing the Method of Distribution for the March 2016 Flood Allocation, Newton County took a very aggressive approach to assist homeowners. We allocated 70% of the funds received by the County to Housing and DISD activities. Of this, 78% went to housing. This is more than any of the remaining four counties receiving a direct March 2016 Flood allocation. The average MOD housing allocation for the remaining four counties is 35% with 65% going to non-housing activities.

Housing – 18,035,447.00 Infrastructure - \$10,611,036.00

In administering the Housing funds, Newton County has gone above and beyond in ensuring the availability of services to assist any eligible homeowner in our county. Extensive marketing outreach has been done throughout the entire county. This outreach has included extending the application deadline multiple times, conducting additional workshops, newspaper ads, phone calls as well as social media.

Again, Newton County has gone above and beyond to ensure all eligible/interested homeowners impacted by the March 2016 floods have either been assisted or are currently in the process of being assisted.

Newton County is requesting to pursue the revision of our 2016 Method of Distribution with the intention of reallocating \$7,500,000.00 from housing to non-housing funds in order to utilize this much needed funding in our county. We currently have infrastructure projects, LMI eligibility and budgets established in order to move swiftly in utilizing these funds. In order to revise the Method of Distribution, bid projects and complete the work the county is also requesting a contract extension of six months.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REVISION OF THE METHOD OF DISTRIBUTION RELATED TO THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM

WHEREAS, in March 2016, Newton County experienced floods that were declared Presidential Disaster Areas; and

WHEREAS, as part of the declaration, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, (HUD) will provide funds to the State of Texas, through the Texas General Land Office (GLO) to be distributed to flood-affected areas to facilitate long-term recovery in the form of Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) funds; and

WHEREAS, on August 14, 2017 the Newton County Commissioner's Court passed and approved a resolution in conjunction with the Method of Distribution for HUD funds through CDBG-DR Federal Award Number B-16-DL-48-0001 received through the Texas General Land Office; and

WHEREAS, the Method of Distribution allocated Seventy Percent (70%) of the funds to Housing activities including Five-Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) to the Deweyville Independent School District (DISD) and Thirty Percent (30%) of the funds to Non-Housing Activities; and on August 31, 2017 the Texas General Land Office approved the Method of Distribution; and

WHEREAS, the funds allocated to the DISD were allocated as Non-Housing funds; and

WHEREAS, after assisting all eligible homeowners desiring to receive assistance through this funding a projected balance of at least Eight-Million Dollars (\$8,000,000) remains; and

WHEREAS, these funds are desperately needed in aiding the citizens of Newton County recover from the 2016 floods.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISIONER'S COURT OF NEWTON COUNTY. TEXAS:

- 1. That the Method of Distribution be amended moving Five-Million dollars (\$5,000.000) allocated to the DISD as Housing funds and reallocating these funds to the DISD as Non-Housing funds.
- That the Method of Distribution be amended reallocating Eight-Million Dollars (\$8,000,000) along with any additional funds that may be remaining at a future date, allocated as Housing funds, to Non-Housing funds.
